NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULE ALTERATION PFA FEDERAL COUNCIL MEETING WEDNESDAY, 18 SEPTEMBER 2019 9.00am AEST (Agenda Item 23 at 4.45pm)

In accordance with PFA rule 16(c), notice is hereby given of a proposed rule alteration listed on the agenda for the Federal Council meeting to be held at the Hotel Realm in Canberra on Wednesday, 18 September 2019 at 9.00am AEST. The specific agenda item is #23 scheduled for 4.45pm.

The purpose of the proposed alteration is to amend Rule 31 that deals with the quorum for any meeting of the Federal Council or the Federal Executive.

PROPOSAL TO AMEND RULE 31:

Currently, Rule 31 of the Police Federation of Australia rules states that "The quorum at any meeting of the Federal Council or the Federal Executive shall be one half of the persons entitled to attend and vote".

You will recall that earlier this year, a Special Federal Council meeting held by teleconference was declared invalid since there were insufficient delegates present on-line or in person to reach a quorum. Following legal advice, it was determined that proxies count towards voting rights however, they do not count towards attendance at the meeting and therefore the quorum.

It is therefore proposed that the Rule be amended to allow for a quorum to be reached with a minimum of one quarter of the members present plus additional proxies to reach a number that is at least one half of members as required. **RECOMMENDATION:**

That Rule 31 be amended to read as follows:

THE QUORUM AT ANY MEETING OF FEDERAL COUNCIL, OR THE FEDERAL EXECUTIVE SHALL BE ONE HALF OF THE PERSONS ENTITLED TO ATTEND AND VOTE, OR VOTE BY PROXY PURSUANT TO CLAUSE (c)(i) OF RULE 30, PROVIDED THAT THERE SHALL BE AT LEAST ONE QUARTER OF THE MEMBERS THEN HOLDING OFFICE ON THE BODY CONCERNED PRESENT IN PERSON AT ALL TIMES DURING THE MEETING.

30 - FEDERAL VOTING

- (a) Voting at meetings of Federal Council and the Federal Executive shall be by show of hands except as otherwise determined by the relevant meeting.
- (b) At meetings of the Federal Council or the Federal Executive the Chair shall have a deliberative vote only.
- (c) In the event of a member of the Federal Council or Federal Executive being for any reason or at any time unable to be present at any meeting of the same or unable to exercise his/her vote or votes as a delegate or Executive member under these Rules;
 - he/she may appoint in writing another member of the Federal Council or Federal Executive as the case may be as his/her proxy to exercise his/her vote or votes at such meeting; or
 - (ii) failing such appointment of a member of the Federal Council, his/her vote or votes may be exercised on his/her behalf by a proxy delegate representing the same Branch members of the Federation, as provided for in the Rules of the Branch affected.

31 - FEDERAL QUORUMS

The quorum at any meeting of Federal Council, or the Federal Executive shall be one half of the persons entitled to attend and vote or vote by proxy pursuant to clause (c)(i) of Rule 30, provided that there shall be at least one quarter of the members then holding office on the body concerned present in person at all times during the meeting.
