Returning Officer actions required (Section 193): Yes

Details:

- Rules regarding the timetable of the election are set aside as the AEC hold concerns that the coronavirus pandemic may impact on the ability for stakeholders to fully participate in the election. A timetable for the conduct of the ballot is varied from the rules was set when the AEC was satisfied that stakeholders would be able to fully participate.
- Rules requiring an in-person ballot are set aside as the AEC hold concerns that the coronavirus pandemic would impact on the ability for all stakeholders to attend. Instead the ballot will be conducted via post.
- Rules specifying the method of lodgement of nominations are set aside as the AEC held concerns that the coronavirus pandemic would impact on the ability for potential candidates to nominate. Instead nominations will be received electronically, via email/the AEC's portal.
